


Arts on the Edge Wolfeboro - Summer 2012

* Our third annual Sculpture in the Parks exhibit will return from June 22 to September 3 in Cate and Clark Parks. Juried by the New England Sculptors Association, this free exhibit brings together artists from all over New England.

July 7 at 10am Northeastern Ballet Theatre, New Hampshire's premier ballet company with one of it's two studios here in Wolfeboro, will present the ballet "Stars and Stripes" as well as an assortment of other dances, and also featuring a concert with local phenomenon The Traveling Wolfeburys, in a free event at the Durgin Stables green on North Main Street next to the Folk Cellar.

- * July 14 at 7pm at Anderson Hall, we will present international recording artist Carrie Newcomer at Anderson Hall, presented in part by The Putnam Foundation. Carrie is a rare breed of singer/songwriter: the kind who illuminates life with startling depth, humor, and clarity. She is one of the definitive voices of the Heartland and progressive spirituality. There will also be an informal talk with Carrie and the audience after the concert. Tickets are \$22 in advance and \$25 at the door.
- * July 28 storyteller Diane Edgecomb and Celtic harpist Margot Chamberlain will present "Midsummer Magic," a free event for all ages in Cate Park at 10am followed by a workshop. This event is sponsored in part by The Booth Foundation, the New England Foundation for the Arts, and the Cate Memorial Lecture Committee.
- * August 22 is our annual poetry day at The Pinkney Boathouse, and will feature workshops and readings with poets Robert Cording, professor at College of the Holy Cross, and Betsy Sholls, former Maine Poet Laureate. The theme of the day will be "Poetry and the Social Conscience." Please pre-register for this event by emailing info@artsedgewolfeboro.org.
- * September 1, multi-faceted concert performer, songwriter, recording artist and musical entrepreneur, Kimball Gallagher will bring his 88 Key Concert Tour to Anderson Hall at 7pm. Tickets are \$20 in advance and \$23 at the door.

The 33rd "Artists in the Park" promises to bring quality and original work to the park. This year there are sixteen new exhibitors and more local talent than we have had in past years.

Local Potters Doug Blum and Gogi Millner (formerly Cornish Hill Pottery shop), will be joined by Bill Spaulding. Paper quilling, scherenschnitte and Origami will be presented by Richard and Roxanne O'Neal; Julio Emilo produces whimsical painted gourd ornaments or free-standing; Susan Arnold hand-paints imaginative canvas rugs; and Jeff Nelson from the Huson River Inlay Furniture Co. will again present detailed marquetry, using rare and beautiful woods. In the fiber and clothing category, Marie and Tim Reimensnyder offer children and adult tee-shirts with cheerful hand stenciled and painted images; Heather Bell offers gorgeous hand painted and sewn silk jackets and kimonos; and Karen Eames brings colorful and practical fabric handbags.

There are more jewelers than usual and they all offer very different work and materials. Local Jeweler Carol Cloutier works in Polymer clay; Rolande Andrews sets sea glass in silver; Ken Kantro (Lovell Designs) offers hand cast pewter items as well as silver and gold-plated jewelry; Patricia Flynn works in birch bark, jewelry as well as home accessories; Susan Scribner Reed offers delicate recycled paper jewelry; Diane Terragni works with "Funky Findings (!); Judith Barker, Jack Dokus and Thomas Kuhner work in silver, gold, and stone settings. Each has their own unique style. Sholeh Regna is a mono-print artist who also works in porcelain jewelry and this year adds ceramic wall reliefs.

It has been a while since we have had such a strong line-up of fine art. In the mixed media category are Barbara Barclay, Betti Williams, and Fay Lee (from Alton). Oil painters are Ginny Nickerson, Cynthia Brown, and Liane Whittum. Bruce Iverson does Chinese Brush Painting (Sumi-e), and Denis Leblanc and Jeanette Fournier are watercolorists. Elizabeth Craumer presents pastel drawing and Roland Simard puts texture into his paintings using hand cast pigmented paper pulp. Nancy Stillwagon paints and stitches around quaint drawings called Trapunto work.

Local photographers, Tom Lavoie and Russell Schundler will be joined by Ronald Wilson, Stephen Eames, Duncan Hall, and George Kelly who does his printing on tiles. There are colorful photos of New England fields and woods, seacoast, as well as travel shots to savor.



Instant purchases are possible at "take away prices" until 3:00pm. Then at 3:30, a Silent Auction will begin in the Bandstand with all the paintings for sale from that day. This is a fundraiser for the Governor Wentworth arts Council with proceeds of 60% to the artists and 40% to GWAC. Contemporary Connections Cristi Rinklin: Diluvial

Organized by the Currier Museum of Art June 9, 2012 - September 9, 2012

This summer, museum visitors will be absorbed in an imaginary landscape of dazzling color and light when they enter Cristi Rinklin's new immersive installation created specifically for the Currier. The museum's collection and a wall of floor-to-ceiling windows in the Putnam Gallery inspired this project, which re-interprets the drama of nine-teenth-century sublime landscape paintings through a contemporary lens.

Rinklin titled her installation "Diluvial" in reference to cycles of creation and ruin and the Great Biblical Flood, which many people through the mid-1800s believed shaped the American landscape and imbued it with spiritual significance. Francis Cropsey's 1857 painting An Indian Summer Morning in the White Mountains melds beauty with foreboding and exemplifies the type of awe-inspiring images that inspired Rinklin's project. Through a combination of hand-painting and digital techniques, Rinklin creates a different pictorial model based on contemporary graphical and technology-generated views of nature.
