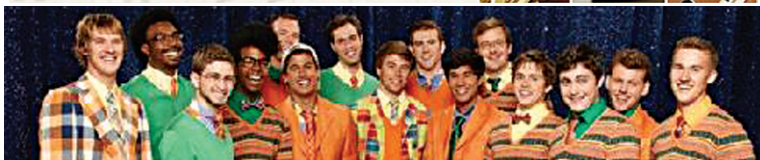
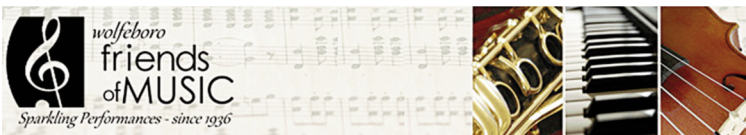

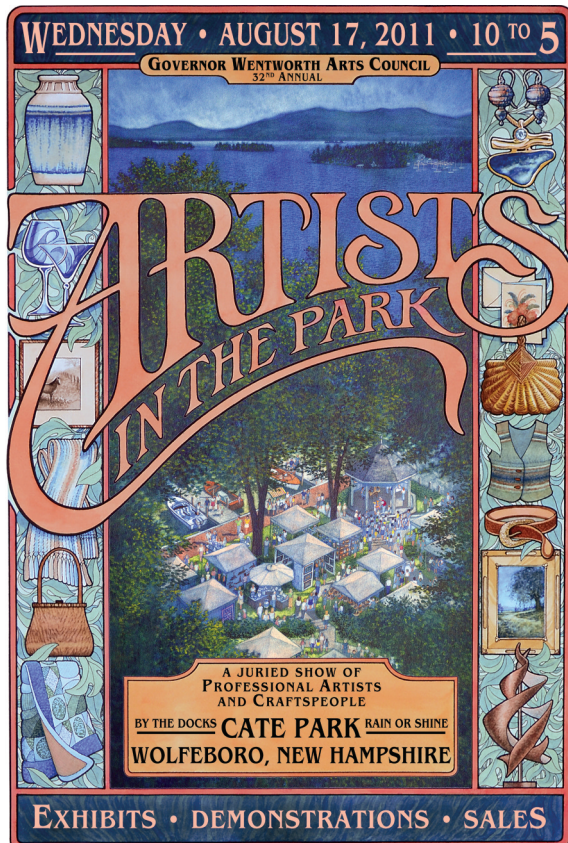

Backstage Pass: Rock & Roll Photography

Organized by the Portland Museum of Art, Portland, Maine
October 7, 2011 – January 15, 2012

Rock & Roll music provided the soundtrack to American culture and shifting social dynamics in the late 20th century. While the genre has undergone many shifts since its origination mid-century, Rock & Roll and its outgrowths have continued to define and shape the social relations and culture of future generations.

Drawn from the largest private collection of photographs of rock musicians in the United States, Backstage Pass: Rock & Roll Photography captures the intimate relationship between photographer and musician. Featuring 175 photographs—many rarely seen by the public—this exhibition provides a portal into the musical and cultural history of Rock & Roll, from its development in the 1950s to its influence on the sounds and styles of future generations. Studio portraits and candid outtakes of famous Rock & Roll stars range from Elvis Presley, Jimi Hendrix and the Beatles to Madonna, Courtney Love and Bob Marley.

Ellsworth Kelly: Wood Sculpture

September 18, 2011 - March 4, 2012

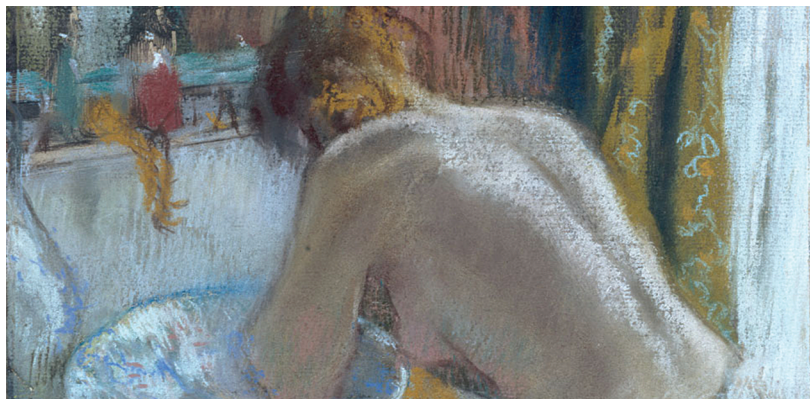
The 30 wood sculptures that Ellsworth Kelly has made over the course of his esteemed career are among his most beautiful and evocative works. Despite Kelly's work being the subject of major retrospectives worldwide, this is the first museum exhibition to focus on the essential and beguiling forms of his wood sculptures. The exhibition features a selection of works across a span of almost forty years and reflects the wide variety of woods, from birch to zebra, which Kelly has used to create both the commanding totemic forms of his freestanding sculptures and the elegant, deceptively simple shapes of his wall reliefs.

Degas and the Nude

October 9, 2011 - February 5, 2012

Gund Gallery, LG31

Breathtaking in scope, intimate in subject
The nude figure was critical to the art of Edgar Degas from the beginning of his career in the 1850s until the end of his working life, but the subject has never before been explored in a Museum exhibition. "Degas and the Nude," co-organized by the Museum of Fine Arts, Boston, and the Musée d'Orsay in Paris, will feature paintings, pastels, drawings, prints, and sculpture, and calls attention to the evolution of the treatment of the nude from Degas's early years, through his triumphant offerings from the 1880s and 1890s, to the last decades of his working career.
